GROW IT AND EAT IT PROJECT FOR HEALTHY LIVING

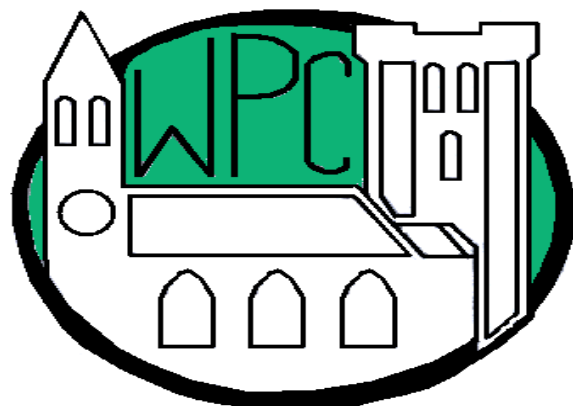

HISTORIC MEETING OF THE YOUTH COUNCIL IN THE TOWN HALL CHAMBER

In yet another first for Winshill, the Youth Council held its meeting in the Council Chamber at the Town Hall. They were greeted by the Mayor, Councillor Patricia Ackroyd, who gave them a short talk on the history of the Council Chamber before showing them round the Mayor's Parlour and the Muniments Room where they saw what we believe to be the oldest football trophy in the world - Burton F.A.'s Challenge Cup.

WINSHILL PARISH YOUTH COUNCIL CHOOSES ITS PREFERRED PLAY AREA DESIGN



Then it was down to business where the main item on the agenda was a new play area for Winshill. They looked at two designs before deciding they wanted to go with a very futuristic design by PROLUDIC a company specialising in Play equipment. Now, all they need to do is raise the £180,000 needed by applying for grants from various organisations including the Olympic Heritage Fund.

The design includes a Social Fitness Zone, a Cyclogym, a Dynamic Zone, a Ball Games Zone and an area called The Legacy which is a multi-level climbing area. Youth Council members were particularly impressed with an online coaching facility that can be accessed by their mobile phone cameras.
