35/12 **MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 3 JULY 2012**

The minutes of the meeting held on 3 July 2012 were agreed and signed as a correct record.

36/12 **NEW MEMBERS**

It was noted that Councillors Aisthorpe and Holmes had been co-opted onto the Council to replace Councillors Khalid and Horton who had left to go to university. As several members had moved school it was agreed that members should be contacted individually in future as well as through the schools. It was also noted that the next elections would take place in September 2013.

37/12 **CORRESPONDENCE RECEIVED**

There was no correspondence to report.

38/12 **EXISTING PROJECTS – PROGRERSS REPORT**

It was reported that the Teen Lights had been installed and that following an early problem when they were operating all night they were now going off at 10.00pm. The members agreed that this had made the play area safer now that it was getting darker at night and that as a result it was being used more regularly in the evening.

The Chairman gave a resume of the Sports Legacy Project and the progress so far in obtaining the necessary funding. To-date the Youth Council had around £7,000 plus the £5,000 from Consolidated Charities and potentially a £2,000 grant from Trent & Dove. A bid had been made for £50,000 to the National Lottery's Awards for All and a further bid of £30,000 was in the process of being made to the Borough Council's Neighbourhood Fund.

Reference was made to the Youth Council's entry in the Winhill in Bloom Competition located on the corner of Canterbury Road, which had received a gold award.

#### 39/12 **FUTURE PROJECTS**

The members undertook an exercise how to plan for future projects as summarised below.

Need to talk to family/friends/school mates; need for passion and enthusiasm as well as being positively involved including raising the funds.

It was suggested that the Youth Council could do an assembly to get their message across to the rest of the children as well as doing press releases where appropriate.

It was reported that the Youth Council currently has existing funds of £7,295.91.

There was a brief discussion about the role of the new Police Commissioner that is soon to be elected. Members considered that Winhill was already well served with officers regularly patrolling on foot and talking to people.
