What's happening in Winshill? Report of Dennis Fletcher, Chair of Parish Council

Welcome to this the fourth newsletter from the Parish Council. As you can see this is a joint venture with the WASPs newsletter. Elsewhere in the newsletter you will find information about an exciting project, "Cleaner, Healthier Winshill," which is due to take place in April and which demonstrates how your Parish and Borough Councillors work in close harmony.

You may have heard that the Parish Council is taking over management of the building formerly used by Trent and Dove Housing. The lease between Trent and Dove and the Parish Council has yet to be finalised and signed but we expect to take over the office sometime in March. Negotiations are well advanced to enable facilities to be used for the benefit of the whole community. Orbit Handy Person Service

The Parish Council recently invited Orbit Housing to a parish meeting to explain the Handy Person Service and to explore how, if at all, the Parish Council could further enhance the scheme for the benefit of Winshill residents.

At present the service covers minor repairs that affect everyday living within the home. It is available to the over 60s and disabled.

The current charges are

- * £5.00 per hour for people in receipt of income support
- * £9.00 per hour for people not receiving income support
- * Help with the cost of materials may be available in cases of hardship.

All that is required is a telephone call requesting a home visit.

Care and repair staff will then

- * Visit your home to see what needs to be done
- * Advise how much the work will cost
- * Arrange for the work to be carried out to a good standard

Good Friday Service Christian churches in Burton

Good Friday 14th April as united Christians we meet outside the Methodist church in High Bank Road. At 11.00am we walk down to Burton Market place, the leader carrying a simple cross. Christians from all over Burton converge in the memorial grounds by St Modwen's church. A short service is held to give thanks for Jesus' death on the cross. The Salvation Army band accompanies the singing to keep us in tune.

Winshill Gospel Hall

The Gospel Hall on Hawfield Lane gives a warm welcome to all. Kids of all ages are invited to kids club, every Sunday from 2.45 – 3.45.

St Mark's Church

March 26th is Mothering Sunday, and at 10.15am there will be a family service in which we give thanks for our mothers, and the children are given small posies for their mothers.

Easter week begins with Palm Sunday, 9th April. You may see the choir and some of the congregation walking in crocodile from the vicarage to church for the 10.15am service, reminding us of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and his welcome by the people.

Thursday 13th is Maundy Thursday, and the celebration of the last supper at church, 7.30pm Holy Communion.

Good Friday 14th, there will be a midday meditative service at St Marks, in addition to the Joint service.

Saturday 15th the church is decorated with spring flowers and commemorative lilies for Easter, and the Paschal candle is lit.

Sunday 16th Easter day, the resurrection is celebrated.

8am Holy Communion,

10.15am Family Holy Communion, and

6.00pm Evensong.

All are welcome to come to any of these activities.

If you walk through St Marks churchyard in late Feb/early March you will see a lovely show of snowdrops followed by Daffodils in March/April.
